

Bonze coin with two tuna


The Phoenicians brought their alphabet. The first that represented sounds through images (letters).



Technological development in vessels:



The important advances that the Phoenicians introduced in their ships, the creation of ports and in the art of navigation. The main novelties were the introduction of rudders and double rows of rowers (biremes, triremes, etc.).

They could also navigate at night using the polar star that until the 19th century was known as a Phoenician star.

Currency:



In much of Europe they used barter or exchange of goods to trade. The arrival of the Phoenicians and the use of the currency made people like the Iberians begin to use the coins as a means of payment.



Wine and oil:

Large-scale cultivation of these products became widespread after the arrival of the Phoenicians.





Salted fish:

One of the main economic activities were fish salted fish.

The Phoenicians put the fish with salt to preserve them and placed it in special amphorae that they then transported throughout the Mediterranean (remember that they spread throughout this sea).





Urbanism:

The Phoenicians, in addition to choosing well the places to settle their colonies and factories, established an urban and housing model that eventually served as a model for the construction of cities or other elements of the city, such as walls or elements defensive.





The Mediterranean Sea was the main route of expansion of what is now Western culture.
